This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is entered into on this 13th day of November 2025, by and between:

Veterans India, a national apolitical patriotic organization registered under the Indian Trust Act, 1882, with its registered office at D-253, Madhu Vihar, Near Sector-3, Dwarka, New Delhi-110059 and corporate office at Plot C-713 B, First Floor, Sector-7 (Market), Dwarka, New Delhi-110077, hereinafter referred to as the "First Party".

AND

Koneru Lakshmaiah Education Foundation, Aziz Nagar Campus, RVS Nagar, Aziz Nagar (PO), Moinabad Road, Hyderabad, R.R. Dist. – 500 075 hereinafter referred to as the "Second Party".

WHEREAS Veterans India is led by ex-servicemen including Gallantry Awardees, families of martyrs, disabled soldiers, and veterans, and is committed to instilling nationalism, patriotism, and civic responsibility among students of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).

WHEREAS the Second Party is a committed educational institution working for holistic development, character-building, and civic empowerment of youth in alignment with national missions.


NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

To collaboratively promote patriotism, nation-building, leadership, and civic values among youth and students of HEIs, and to support the empowerment and welfare of martyrs' families, disabled soldiers, ex-servicemen and their families through structured initiatives of Veterans India.

2. SCOPE OF STRATEGIC COLLABORATION

- a. Conducting veteran-led patriotic events, lectures, and leadership programs across campuses.
- b. Supporting the Pride of Nation Awards and the State-wise HEI Ranking Initiative based on contributions to nation-building, patriotism, civic engagement, sports, Indian Knowledge Systems, women and youth empowerment, and social impact.
- c. Establishing structured student mentorship and career preparation for SSB, CDS, and armed forces roles.
- d. Collaborating with the Veterans India Youth Wing for sports, fitness, and Fit India-aligned events.
- e. Offering internship opportunities to students in technology, management, outreach, and community development.
- f. Hosting programs such as self-defense training, defense preparedness, motivational seminars, and cultural values enhancement.



- g. Providing in-campus logistical and infrastructural support free of cost for all joint activities
- h. Participating in regular awareness campaigns and welfare initiatives benefiting martyrs' families, disabled soldiers, and veterans

3. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

3.1 Responsibilities of Veterans India

- a. Design and execution of programs, awareness drives, and workshops
- b. Mobilize veterans for lectures, mentoring, and leadership guidance
- c. Manage the State-wise Patriotic Ranking Framework for HEIs
- d. Coordinate the Pride of Nation Awards and national recognition initiatives
- e. Provide platforms for student internships across its 18 Wings
- f. Facilitate national-level forums, expert talks, and strategic reviews
- g. Monitor and report progress of each collaborative activity

3.2 Responsibilities of the College/Institute/University

- a. Appoint a dedicated nodal officer and student team for coordination.
- b. Ensure active participation in the Pride of Nation Ranking System.
- c. Host and promote all activities aligned with the MoU on-campus.
- d. Provide space, infrastructure, and volunteer manpower as needed.
- e. Nominate students and faculty for internship and ambassador programs.
- f. Disseminate circulars, calls for participation, and reports to stakeholders.
- g. Collaborate on projects for the empowerment of martyrs' families, disabled soldiers, ex-servicemen, and their families through skilling, employability, recognition, or resource mobilization as feasible.
- h. Incorporate value-based patriotic programs into induction or extension education modules where applicable.

4. MONETARY UNDERSTANDING

Honorariums for veterans and experts may be provided by mutual agreement. Any other costs shall be discussed separately and formalized through specific agreements as required.

5. TENURE AND TERMINATION

This MoU shall remain in force for a period of Five (5) years from the date of execution and will automatically renew for three (3) more years unless terminated in writing with a 90-day notice by either party. In the event of any material breach, the non-breaching party may terminate this MoU with 30 days' notice.

6. GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

This MoU is governed by the laws of the Republic of India. Any disputes shall first be attempted to be resolved amicably, failing which it shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts at New Delhi.



7. AMENDMENTS AND COUNTERPARTS

Any modifications to this MoU shall be made in writing with consent from both parties. Scanned and digitally signed versions shall be considered legally valid.
